REGULAR MEETING
SEPTEMBER 12, 2016
6:00 P.M.
AMERICAN LEGION POST 45**

MAYOR HUFF OPENED MEETING AND WELCOMED EVERYONE.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION STATEMENT WAS READ BY MAYOR HUFF CONCERNING NOTIFICATION OF THIS MEETING.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE WAS LED BY POLICE CHAPLAIN BILL HOLLAND.

COUNCILMEMBERS MELVIN FOWLER, KEVIN NEWMAN, GINGER MORROW MCGUIRE AND RAY ROGERS, JR. WERE PRESENT.

CITY ATTORNEY LARRY FLYNN, JR. WAS PRESENT.

COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE MADE A MOTION TO REMOVE ITEM E. UNDER 12: NEW BUSINESS FROM THE AGENDA, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

MISS LINDSEY BURRELL, REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MAYOR'S YOUTH COUNCIL REPORTED THAT THEY ARE EXCITED TO BE BACK FOR THEIR SECOND YEAR AND SHE INTRODUCED THE NEW STUDENTS (CHAPMAN HIGH JUNIORS & SENIORS) WHO JOINED THE COUNCIL FOR THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR. MISS BURRELL STATED THAT THEIR VISION IS TO HELP WITH ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN INMAN AND TO BE ACTIVE LEADERS IN THE COMMUNITY.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 8, 2016 REGULAR MEETING, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE READ A PROCLAMATION FOR "HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH 2016" AND PRESENTED IT TO MS. SARA MONTERO MARIA WHO IS ORIGINALLY FROM MEXICO BUT HAS BEEN CALLING SOUTH CAROLINA HER HOME FOR FIFTEEN (15) YEARS.

COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER READ A PROCLAMATION FOR "THE AMERICAN LEGION DAY" AND PRESENTED IT TO MR. CHARLES TAPP OF THE AMERICAN LEGION POST 45.

MS. CASEY NUNNAMAKER, TEACHER WITH THE MAYOR'S YOUTH COUNCIL REPORTED THAT THE COMMUNITY GARDEN WAS A HUGE SUCCESS LAST YEAR AND A LARGE PART OF THE SUCCESS WAS DUE TO THE FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS THEY RECEIVED FROM BUSINESSES IN THE CITY OF INMAN. THE MAYOR'S YOUTH COUNCIL SENIORS PRESENTED SPONSOR AWARDS TO THEIR LARGEST DONORS AND THEY WERE THE INMAN UNITED METHODIST CHURCH, MICHELE SCHWARTZBAUER OF SUNNYSIDE CHIROPRACTIC, AND TERRY STEPHENSON OF MCDONALDS.

POLICE CHIEF KEITH TUCKER REPORTED 39 CRIMINAL, 22 TRAFFIC AND 1 ACCIDENT TOTALLING \$1500 IN DAMAGES FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 2016. CHIEF TUCKER ALSO REPORTED THAT THEY WERE BUSY THE FIRST THREE WEEKS OF SCHOOL WITH TRAFFIC AND THEY HAVE BEEN OVERWHELMED WITH SUPPORT FROM THE COMMUNITY WITH PEOPLE BRINGING CARDS AND FOOD. CHIEF TUCKER STATED THAT THIS YEAR THE "BOO

ON BLACKSTOCK” WILL BE MOVED TO MILL STREET AND IT WILL BE HELD ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2016 FROM 5 TO 8 PM SO IF ANYONE WOULD LIKE TO DONATE CANDY OR IF A BUSINESS WANTS TO SET UP A TABLE TO HAND OUT CANDY AND ADVERTISE TO PLEASE LET HIM KNOW AND HE IS CONSIDERING A “COSTUME CONTEST” THIS YEAR ALSO.

FIRE CHIEF CHRIS COTHRAN REPORTED 30 CALLS FOR THE PERIOD OF 08/08/2016 THRU 09/12/2016 WITH 6-MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS WITH INJURY, 6-COMMERCIAL FIRE ALARMS, 3-ASSIST AMBULANCE, 1-SET UP LANDING ZONE, 2- MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS WITH PERSONS TRAPPED, 1-ASSIST A CITIZEN, 3-MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS INVOLVING PEDESTRIAN, 2-RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE FIRES, 1-SPECIAL ASSIGNMENTS, AND 5-LOCKOUTS. CHIEF COTHRAN ALSO REPORTED THAT THE ACCIDENT WITH PERSON TRAPPED INVOLVED TWO (2) STUDENTS FROM CHAPMAN HIGH SCHOOL WHO WERE IN A HEAD ON COLLISION AND ONE OF THE STUDENTS WASN'T WEARING A SEATBELT BUT HE IS GRATEFUL TO REPORT THAT SHE WILL BE OKAY SO CHIEF COTHRAN ENCOURAGED EVERYONE TO PLEASE WEAR YOUR SEATBELT. CHIEF COTHRAN STATED THAT THEY HELD A 9/11 CEREMONY IN FRONT OF CITY HALL ON FRIDAY MORNING (09/09/16), ATTENDED A 9/11 SERVICE AT INMAN FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH ON SUNDAY MORNING AND LANDRUM FIRST BAPTIST SUNDAY EVENING. CHIEF COTHRAN ANNOUNCED THAT THEY WILL BE HANDING OUT FIRE PREVENTION MATERIAL ON HARVEST DAY, SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2016.

MAYOR HUFF ANNOUNCED THAT SEWER SUPERINTENDENT JEFF BAILEY WAS ABSENT DUE TO ATTENDING A S.C. RURAL WATER CONFERENCE IN MYRTLE BEACH AND HE IS HAPPY TO REPORT THAT MR. BARRY STAPLETON OF OUR WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT WILL BE RECEIVING THE AWARD FOR “S.C. WASTEWATER OPERATOR OF THE YEAR”.

MR. HEATH FOWLER OF THE STREETS/MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT REPORTED THAT THE DHEC STORMWATER AUDIT WENT VERY WELL WITH MINIMAL REMARKS; HE HAS CONTACTED THE S.C. DOT AND THE COUNTY OF SPARTANBURG ABOUT CUTTING GRASS ON THE EDGES OF THE ROAD AND HE HAS BEEN BUSY CUTTING GRASS IN THE CITY WITH ALL THE RAIN WE HAVE HAD. MR. FOWLER ALSO REPORTED THAT HE HAS WORKED ON COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER'S REQUEST FOR A SIGN TO BE REPLACED ON BOBO STREET AND HE IS GETTING THINGS READY FOR HARVEST DAY. MR. FOWLER STATED THAT HE IS CONSIDERING WORKING AT NIGHT TO REMOVE THE FAÇADE LIGHTS FROM THE BUILDINGS DOWNTOWN AND HOPES TO START IN THE NEXT COUPLE OF WEEKS SO HE CAN GET THEM SENT BACK TO UNIVERSAL CONCEPTS SO THEY CAN SEND US REPLACEMENTS AND HE CAN GET THOSE LIGHTS UP IN OCTOBER. MAYOR HUFF QUESTIONED ABOUT THE LANDSCAPING FOR THE “WELCOME TO INMAN” SIGNS AND MR. FOWLER STATED THAT WHEN THE GRASS SLOWS DOWN HE SHOULD HAVE PLENTY OF TIME TO WORK ON THAT PROJECT.

MR. PETE MILLER, CHAIRMAN OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION REPORTED THAT THEY ARE WORKING ON THREE PROJECTS AND THEY ARE: 1. NON-DOMESTIC ANIMALS (CHICKENS) AND THEY ARE FINALIZING THE DETAILS AND SHOULD HAVE A PROPOSAL FOR COUNCIL NEXT MONTH; 2. ELECTRONIC SIGNS –THEY HAVE NOTHING IN THE ZONING ORDINANCE ON ELECTRONIC SIGNS AND THEY ARE WORKING ON THE PARAMETERS FOR THAT AND 3. A NEW SUBDIVISION THAT IS COMING IN BEHIND BI-LO ON FIFTEEN (15) ACRES AND THEY WERE WORKING ON THAT PROJECT AND LAST FRIDAY THE PRESENTATION CHANGED SO THEY WILL BE STARTING FROM SCRATCH. MR. MILLER STATED THAT THEY WILL HAVE THEIR NEXT PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING IN TWO WEEKS.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR JEREMY CAUDLE REPORTED THAT HE HAD SUBMITTED TO COUNCIL A REPORT ON HIS ACTIVITIES SINCE HE STARTED SEPTEMBER 1, 2016 AND HE MENTIONED THAT HE WANTED TO LISTEN, LEARN AND OBSERVE AND THAT'S BEEN THE

MAJOR PART OF WHAT HE HAS BEEN DOING. MR. CAUDLE THANKED THE PLANNING COMMISSION CHAIRMAN PETE MILLER FOR HIS EFFORTS IN SHOWING HIM HOW THE PROCESS WORKS HERE IN INMAN AS WELL AS OUR ZONING ADMINISTRATOR DENNIS STATON AND HE HAS SPOKEN WITH OUR CITY ATTORNEY LARRY FLYNN AND THEY PLAN ON WORKING THROUGH THE NECESSARY REGULATIONS TO HAVE A DRAFT FOR COUNCIL'S CONSIDERATION AS WELL AS THE PLANNING COMMISSION. MR. CAUDLE STATED THAT ANOTHER ITEM IS WITH A POTENTIAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GRANT OPPORTUNITY OF \$25,000 AND HE WOULD LIKE SOME FEEDBACK FROM COUNCIL FOR SOME POTENTIAL PROJECTS TO WHICH HE CAN APPLY FOR AND THE DEADLINE IS SEPTEMBER 30, 2016.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE SECOND READING ON ORDINANCE NO. 16-20, TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 12-11, ARTICLE XIV SECTION 1401 OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF INMAN, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

CITY CLERK ROBIN HENDERSON REPORTED THAT THE CONTRACT WITH THE LOBBYIST BEGAN ON JANUARY 1, 2016 AND ENDS DECEMBER 31, 2016 AND IT IS THOUGHT THAT A THIRTY (30) DAY NOTICE CAN BE GIVEN TO END THE CONTRACT SOONER.

COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE QUESTIONED IF THE LOBBYIST SERVICES WAS IN THE 2016-2017 BUDGET AND CLERK HENDERSON REPLIED NO.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN MADE A MOTION TO GIVE A THIRTY (30) DAY NOTICE AND DISSOLVE THE CONTRACT WITH THE LOBBYIST SINCE IT IS NOT IN THIS YEAR'S BUDGET, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. QUESTIONED IF WE WOULD HAVE GOTTEN THE \$200,000 IN GRANTS IF IT WASN'T FOR THE LOBBYIST THEN HE HAS A PROBLEM DISSOLVING THE CONTRACT AND HE THOUGHT THAT THIS WAS PUT IN THIS YEARS BUDGET.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. MADE A MOTION TO TABLE THIS ITEM UNTIL THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR CAN FIND A WAY TO PUT THIS IN THE BUDGET BEFORE WE DISSOLVE THE CONTRACT, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH MAYOR HUFF'S VOTE. COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN AND COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE VOTED AGAINST THE MOTION.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN REPORTED THAT A PRIVATE CITIZEN WANTED TO BRING A BIG NAME BAND TO INMAN AND THEY ARE WILLING TO PAY THE MONEY TO HAVE THEM HERE SO HE IS ASKING TO TRANSFER THE \$2700 FROM THE HOSPITALITY TAX BUDGET FOR "MUSIC ON MILL" THAT WAS NOT SPENT IN THE 2015-2016 FISCAL YEAR SO IT CAN BE USED FOR ADVERTISING AND POLICE & FIRE SERVICES FOR A CONCERT ON THE FRIDAY NIGHT BEFORE HARVEST DAY.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN MADE A MOTION TO CARRY OVER THE \$2700 THAT WAS LEFT IN THE 2015-2016 "MUSIC ON MILL" BUDGET TO PUT INTO THIS CONCERT CALLED "ONE LAST NIGHT OF SUMMER" WITH THE SWINGING MEDALLIONS ON SEPTEMBER 23, 2016 FROM 7 TO 10 PM, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR., MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

MR. CHRISTIAN MONTAGENO, EMERGENCY MD PHYSICIAN ADDRESSED COUNCIL REGARDING A NEW PRIVATELY OWNED EMERGENCY PHYSICIAN PRACTICE OPENING IN THE BOILING SPRINGS/INMAN AREA THAT WILL PROVIDE EMERGENCY ROOM CARE FOR A LOWER RATE OF WHAT A HOSPITAL EMERGENCY ROOM WOULD COST. MR. MONTAGENO STATED THAT THEIR PHYSICIANS HANDLE A WIDE ARRAY OF ISSUES RANGING FROM THE COMMON COLD TO MORE COMPLEX ISSUES SUCH AS FRACTURES, ABDOMINAL PAIN, CHEST PAIN, ETC. AND THEY OFFER MULTI-MODALITY ONSITE TESTING SUCH AS X-RAY, CAT SCAN, AND ULTRASOUND ALL UNDER ONE ROOF. MR. MONTAGENO REPORTED THAT THEY CAN HELP THE CITY OF INMAN WITH PRE-EMPLOYMENT PHYSICALS AS WELL AS DRUG TESTS AND THEY ACCEPT ALL TYPES OF INSURANCE BUT THEY NOTED THAT A CONTRACT WITH THEM IS NOT NECESSARY.

CITY ATTORNEY LARRY FLYNN, JR. STATED THAT HE HAS PUT A DRAFT TOGETHER FOR THE AGREEMENT WITH INMAN FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH REGARDING THE PARKING LOT FOR THE FARMERS MARKET AND HE HAS HAD SOME CONVERSATIONS AND IDEAS ABOUT WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE BUT THIS ONLY GIVES THE MAYOR THE AUTHORIZATION TO SIGN ON BEHALF OF COUNCIL WHILE WE WORK OUT THE DETAILS. MR. FLYNN STATED THAT WE DON'T HAVE ALL THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS SPELLED OUT BUT HE SHOULD BE ABLE TO PUT IT TOGETHER.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR STATED THAT THERE ARE THREE (3) CHANGES THAT NEED TO BE ADDRESSED AND ATTORNEY LARRY FLYNN REPORTED THAT HE HAS GOTTEN THE NOTES FROM CLERK HENDERSON AND WILL INCORPORATE THEM.

MAYOR HUFF STATED THAT THEY WILL ADDRESS THIS AGREEMENT WITH THE CHANGES AT THE NEXT COUNCIL MEETING.

MRS. TINA WILSON OF THE CHAPMAN HIGH SCHOOL PANTHER TD CLUB ADDRESSED COUNCIL REGARDING A REQUEST FOR \$1,000 OF HOSPITALITY TAX FUNDS TO PROVIDE MEALS FOR THE CHAPMAN HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL PLAYERS AFTER THEIR PRACTICES ON MONDAY NIGHT DURING THE 2016 SEASON TO SHOW APPRECIATION TO THE COACHES AND PLAYERS FOR THEIR HARD WORK AND HELP BRING THE COMMUNITY TOGETHER.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. QUESTIONED IF HOSPITALITY TAX FUNDS CAN BE SPENT ON FOOD FOR THE PLAYERS. CITY ATTORNEY LARRY FLYNN STATED THAT THERE HAS TO BE SOME TOURISM BENEFIT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF THE HOSPITALITY TAX FUNDS. MRS. WILSON ALSO STATED THAT THE REQUESTED HOSPITALITY TAX FUNDS WOULD BE USED FOR ADVERTISING BECAUSE THEY HAVE OTHER TEAMS COMING IN EVERY FRIDAY NIGHT FOR THE FOOTBALL GAMES AND THE SEVEN (7) ON SEVEN (7) TOURNAMENT WHICH BRINGS IN A LOT OF PEOPLE DURING THE SUMMER.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE REQUEST FROM THE CHAPMAN HIGH SCHOOL PANTHER TD CLUB FOR \$1,000 OF HOSPITALITY FUNDS FOR SPONSORED MEALS FOR THE CHAPMAN HIGH FOOTBALL TEAM, ADVERTISING AND THE SEVEN (7) ON SEVEN (7) TOURNAMENT, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH MAYOR HUFF AND COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN VOTES. COUNCILMEMBER MCGUIRE DID NOT VOTE.

POLICE CHIEF KEITH TUCKER REPORTED THAT THEY HAVE TWO (2) DODGE CHARGERS THAT WAS PURCHASED WITH AN ANNUAL PAYMENT PLAN AND THEY WILL BE PAID OFF THIS BUDGET YEAR AND THE MONEY THAT IS USED TO MAKE THE PAYMENT COMES FROM A CONTRACT WITH DISTRICT ONE SCHOOLS FOR \$7,200 A YEAR. CHIEF TUCKER STATED THAT THEY ARE LOOKING INTO PURCHASING ANOTHER POLICE CAR AND THE PAYMENT ON THIS NEW CAR WILL BE \$7,484 YEARLY SO HE IS LOOKING AT THE DIFFERENCE COMING OUT OF HIS BUDGET IN THE EQUIPMENT FUND LINE ITEM. CHIEF TUCKER STATED THAT HE IS PROPOSING THAT SINCE THE CITY IS IN NEED OF AN ADMIN CAR THAT HE HAS A 2010 FORD CROWN VICTORIA THAT THE CITY CAN USE AS AN ADMIN CAR FOR THOSE WHO NEED TO TRAVEL TO CLASSES/ RUN ERRANDS OR IF THE CITY DOESN'T WANT THE CAR THEN THEY CAN PUT THE CAR UP FOR SALE. CHIEF TUCKER REPORTED THAT THE NEW CAR WILL BE PURCHASED THROUGH A STATE CONTRACT PRICE FROM O.C. WELCH IN HARDEEVILLE, SC.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN QUESTIONED WHY THIS WAS BEING DONE A YEAR EARLY. CHIEF TUCKER STATED THAT O. C. WELCH IN HARDEEVILLE HAS A COUPLE OF VEHICLES LEFT OVER AND THE VEHICLES NORMALLY SELL FOR \$25,000 BUT THEY ARE SELLING IT FOR \$26,780 WITH EQUIPMENT (LIGHTS, ETC) INSTALLED SO WHEN THEY PICK IT UP IT IS READY FOR USE.

CITY ATTORNEY LARRY FLYNN QUESTIONED ABOUT FOLLOWING THE PROCUREMENT PROCEDURE AND HOW THE CITY WILL BE PAYING FOR THE CAR. MR. FLYNN STATED THAT COUNCIL CAN AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF THE VEHICLE AND THEN COME BACK

BEFORE COUNCIL AT A LATER DATE WITH A PROPOSAL OF HOW THE VEHICLE IS GOING TO BE FINANCED.

COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF A POLICE CAR FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF INMAN WITH A PROPOSAL OF HOW THE VEHICLE WILL BE FINANCED AT A LATER DATE, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR JEREMY CAUDLE REPORTED THAT WE ARE TRYING TO PLAN AN EVENT TO BRING THE AUTHORS OF THE BOOK "WE ARE CHARLESTON" A COMPREHENSIVE ACCOUNT OF LAST SUMMER'S TRAGIC EVENTS AT SOUTH CAROLINA'S MOTHER EMANUEL CHURCH TO INMAN TO PARTICIPATE IN A BREAKFAST CONVERSATION.

MAYOR HUFF STATED THAT THE AUTHORS WILL BE COMING TO THE CHAPMAN CULTURAL CENTER IN SPARTANBURG IN OCTOBER AND THEY WANT TO COME TO INMAN THE NEXT MORNING BEFORE THEY GO BACK TO CHARLESTON SO HE WOULD LIKE TO DO SOME TYPE OF BREAKFAST EVENT WITH CATERING SERVICES FOR ABOUT \$1,000 AND HE WANTED TO MAKE SURE COUNCIL WAS OKAY WITH MOVING FORWARD WITH THIS EVENT. CITY ADMINISTRATOR JEREMY CAUDLE STATED THAT HE IS STILL WORKING ON GETTING PRICES FOR CATERING SERVICES AND THE AUTHORS ARE COMING HERE AT NO COST TO THE CITY BUT THEY WOULD LIKE FOR PEOPLE TO CONSIDER PURCHASING THEIR BOOK. MAYOR HUFF STATED THAT THIS EVENT WILL BE A BOOK SIGNING AND WILL BRING PEOPLE TO DOWNTOWN.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. MADE A MOTION FOR THE MAYOR TO WORK WITH ADMINISTRATOR JEREMY CAUDLE AND PLAN THE EVENT FOR OCTOBER 14, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. STATED THAT HE HAD REQUESTED THE "DISCUSSION ON CLEAN UP IN CITY FOR HARVEST DAY" TO BE ON THE AGENDA BUT MR. HEATH FOWLER HAS ADDRESSED SOME OF THE ISSUES HE HAD REGARDING GRASS NEEDING TO BE CUT IN HIS REPORT BUT THE MAIN COMPLAINT HE HAD AS FAR AS DOWNTOWN IS THE FLOWER POTS NEED TO BE PRESSURE WASHED AND THE DEAD PLANTS REMOVED.

UNDER PUBLIC COMMENTS:

MR. CHARLES TAPP OF THE AMERICAN LEGION POST 45 STATED THAT THEY ARE RAFFLING OFF TICKETS ON HARVEST DAY FOR A COOKER TO RAISE MONEY FOR THE AMERICAN LEGION.

MR.
