

INMAN CITY COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING
JUNE 11, 2018
6:00 PM
COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL

MAYOR CORNELIUS HUFF CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER.
FREEDOM OF INFORMATION STATEMENT WAS READ BY MAYOR HUFF CONCERNING NOTIFICATION OF THIS MEETING.
INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE WAS LED BY INMAN POLICE CHAPLAIN BILL HOLLAND.
COUNCILMEMBERS MELVIN FOWLER, RAY ROGERS, JR., KEVIN NEWMAN, AND GINGER MORROW-MCGUIRE WERE PRESENT.
COUNCILMEMBER MORROW-MCGUIRE MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE AGENDA, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

MAYOR HUFF REPORTED THAT THE MAYOR'S YOUTH COUNCIL WAS NOT PRESENT TONIGHT BUT THEY HAVE BEEN WORKING HARD IN THE COMMUNITY GARDEN.

COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MAY 14, 2018 PUBLIC HEARING; MAY 14, 2018 REGULAR MEETING; AND THE MAY 31, 2018 SPECIAL MEETING/BUDGET WORK SESSION, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MORROW-MCGUIRE, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

POLICE CHIEF KEITH TUCKER REPORTED 44 CRIMINAL, 72 TRAFFIC AND 9 ACCIDENTS TOTALLING \$30,800 IN DAMAGES FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 2018. CHIEF TUCKER ALSO STATED THAT SCHOOL IS OUT NOW SO EVERYONE NEEDS TO BE CAREFUL WITH CHILDREN PLAYING.

FIRE CHIEF CHRIS COTHRAN REPORTED 32 CALLS FOR THE PERIOD OF 05/14/2018 THRU 06/11/2018 WITH SMOKE ALARMS WITH THE MOST CALLS.

SEWER SUPERINTENDENT JEFF BAILEY REPORTED THE TOP TEN WORK HISTORY SUMMARY REPORT WITH CUTTING GRASS WITH THE MOST HOURS.

STREET SUPERVISOR HEATH FOWLER REPORTED CUTTING GRASS, TRIMMING HEDGES, ATTENDING THE STREETScape PROJECT UPDATE MEETINGS, ATTENDING DHEC MEETING FOR STORMWATER, AND PLACING FLYERS ON BUSINESS OWNERS DOORS FOR THE FAÇADE GRANT.

PLANNING COMMISSION CHAIRMAN PETE MILLER REPORTED THAT THE COMMISSION DID NOT MEET ON THEIR REGULAR SCHEDULED MEETING DAY BECAUSE IT WAS MEMORIAL DAY BUT THEY DID NOT HAVE ANYTHING PRESSING GOING ON.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR JEREMY CAUDLE REPORTED THAT COUNCIL HAD DISCUSSED EARLIER ABOUT ADDING 4 STREET LIGHTS ON MILL STREET SO THEY WENT AHEAD AND INSTRUCTED THE CONTRACTORS TO INSTALL THE CONDUIT AND THE WIRING AND HE IS PRESENTING TO COUNCIL THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH INSTALLING THE STREET LIGHTS.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE LIGHTING ADDITION, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE SECOND READING OF ORDINANCE #2018-10, AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE BUDGET ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2018, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE ADVERTISING FOR THE UPCOMING EQUESTRIAN GAMES IN THE TRYON DAILY BULLETIN FOR \$700 WITH THE CHAMBER PAYING THE \$350 FOR TWO (2) FULL PAGES FOR A TOTAL OF \$1,050, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH HOLLY SPRINGS FIRE-RESCUE DISTRICT TO INITIATE AUTOMATIC MUTUAL DISPATCH SERVICES, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE FIRST READING OF ORDINANCE #2018-12, AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE LEVY OF PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2018 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2019; TO ADOPT A BUDGET APPROPRIATING REVENUES FOR SPECIFIED PRUPOSES; AND TO SET COMPENSATION FOR THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

UNDER PUBLIC COMMENTS:

MRS. TERI NEWMARK OF THE INMAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE STATED THAT PLANNING HARVEST DAY IS A LOT OF WORK AND QUESTIONED WITH THE STREETScape PROJECT HOW CAN COUNCIL MINIMIZE LIABLILTY EXPOSURES AND HOW CAN THEY PLAN FOR HARVEST DAY.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. STATED THAT THE CHAMBER NEEDS A PLAN B IN PLACE IF THEY ARE NOT ABLE TO HAVE HARVEST DAY ON MAIN STREET AND INVITED THEM TO ATTEND THE CONSTRUCTION UPDATE MEETING AT 2PM NEXT WEDNESDAY.

MS. KATE CLARK OF THE ACTIVE LIVING WITH THE INMAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE REPORTED THAT THEY ARE PLANNING A 5K RACE TO BE HELD ON HARVEST DAY AT THE LEROY MATHIS PARK SO WITH THE STREETScape PROJECT THEY WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT THEY HAVE A ROUTE THAT IS SAFE SO SHE WILL GET WITH THE POLICE CHIEF.

UNDER COUNCIL TIME:

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN STATED THAT THERE ARE 2 MORE WEEKS OF "MUSIC ON MILL" WITH JUNE 22, 2018 BEING A MAKEUP DATE WITH A DIFFERENT BAND BUT THE CAR SHOW WAS A HUGE SUCCESS.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. STATED THAT HE IS LOOKING FORWARD TO ANOTHER YEAR ON COUNCIL SINCE SPARTANBURG COUNTY CHANGED THE CITY'S ELECTION DATE AND HE URGED EVERYONE TO VOTE TOMORROW.

MAYOR HUFF STATED THAT MISS INMAN AND MISS INMAN TEEN WILL HAVE AN EVENT ON JUNE 19 AND HE WILL BE THERE AND BOTH QUEENS ARE LOOKING GOOD.
