MAYOR CORNELIUS HUFF CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION STATEMENT WAS READ BY MAYOR HUFF CONCERNING NOTIFICATION OF THIS MEETING.

INVOCATION WAS GIVEN BY INMAN POLICE CHAPLAIN BILL HOLLAND.

COUNCILMEMBERS MELVIN FOWLER, KEVIN NEWMAN, GINGER MORROW-MCGUIRE AND RAY ROGERS, JR. WERE PRESENT.

COUNCILMEMBER NEWMAN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS WRITTEN, SECOND TO THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER FOWLER, MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL VOTING.

COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. STATED THAT WITH REGARDS TO THE RENOVATIONS PLANS TO CITY HALL THAT HE HAS PRESENTED TO COUNCIL THAT HIS NUMBER ONE PRIORITY IS THE SECURITY OF THE BUILDING, ADDRESSING PUBLIC ACCESS AND PROVIDING MORE SPACE.

AFTER COUNCIL AND STAFF DISCUSSION, MAYOR HUFF QUESTIONED WHAT IS OUR NEXT STEP AND COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. SUGGESTED THAT WE GET AN INTERIOR DESIGNER TO WORK WITH THE PLAN AND TO GET HER THOUGHTS OF HOW TOMAKE THIS WORK INTO THE TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY WITH PHYSICAL CHANGES ON THE COSMETIC SIDE AND THE SECURITY SIDE AND ONCE WE FIGURE OUT THE COST THEN LOOK FOR WAYS TO FUND IT. CITY ADMINISTRATOR MISSY HOUSE STATED THAT SHE WOULD LOOK INTO A GRANT OR A LOW INTEREST LOAN TO FUND THE RENOVATION PROJECT. COUNCILMEMBER ROGERS, JR. STATED THAT WE ARE GOING WITH SECURITY, UPGRADE AND ADA COMPLIANCE.
