


# Get Involved!

	<b>Planning Commission</b>	<b>Board of Zoning Appeals</b>
<b><i>What it does...</i></b>	The Planning Commission is responsible for developing and updating the city's comprehensive plan. The comprehensive plan guides development decisions within the city. The commission also creates and recommends changes to the zoning regulations.	If a property owner disagrees with the city's zoning decisions, then this board has the power to grant exceptions to the city's zoning rules.
<b><i>You should serve if...</i></b>	You're a creative thinker. You have good ideas on what it takes to help Inman grow and improve its quality of life.	You're fair and good and looking at all sides of an issue. You have good judgment. You're a logical thinker. You're impartial.



Members of the Planning Commission serve for four-year terms, while Zoning Appeals members serve three-year terms.
